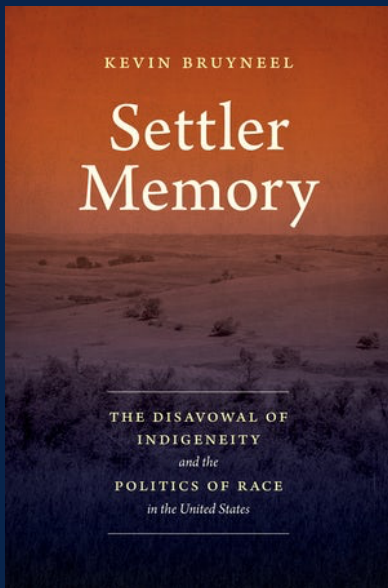

# SETTLER MEMORY

Join us for a virtual book talk where Kevin Bruyneel (Babson College) will introduce his book and Mishuana Goeman (Tonawanda Band of Seneca, UCLA) and Ho'esta Mo'e'hane (UCLA) will respond. An open discussion will follow.



In this ambitious new book, Kevin Bruyneel confronts the chronic displacement of Indigeneity in the politics and discourse around race in American political theory and culture, arguing that the ongoing influence of settler-colonialism has undermined efforts to understand Indigenous politics while also hindering conversation around race itself. By reexamining major episodes, texts, writers, and memories of the political past from the 17th century to the present, Bruyneel reveals the power of settler memory at work in the persistent disavowal of Indigeneity.
